## Common Symptoms

Vomiting, drooling, incoordination, seeming drunk, swelling of the mouth, abnormal body temperature, twitches and tremors, breathing difficulty, seizures, passing out.



## Keep in mind

- ! Some things that are harmless to us are toxic to our pets. Research what the most common poisons are for your pet's species.
- ! Keep toxic materials, such as cleaning supplies and medicines, locked outside of your pet's reach.
- ! Ensure your pet can't open the bin, or dispose of toxic products outside.
- ! Never give your pet human medicines.

## Has your pet been poisoned?

- Remove your pet from the source of the poison.
- Call your vet immediately, even if your pet seems fine.
- If you can safely do so, collect a sample of the poison to bring with you to the vet, along with any packaging.
